P'yōn Hye-yōng (Pyun Hye-Young), winner of the prestigious Hanguk Ilbo Prize in 2007, is the author of the story collections *Mallow Gardens* (2005) and *To the Kennels* (2007). Infused with grotesque imagery, her stories depict an apocalyptic world.
