Joseph Masco, University of Chicago

"The Age of Fallout: Terraforming Planet Earth"

This talk tracks the emergence of planetary awareness after 1945, enabled by systematically tracking radioactive contamination through the biosphere. It offers a critical theory of "fallout" as a way to consider the imbrication of nuclear danger and climate danger today. Utilizing a wide range of visual texts, the paper reframes the Cold War nuclear contest as part of a larger global nuclear infrastructure of fallout generating sites.
